Tip by Jim Mason...

When using a 4-jaw chuck, make your tennon as close to the size of the chuck as possible so that when the jaw is tightened there is only 3/16 of an inch between each of the 4 jaws. If the gap is much larger the jaws will fit only in 8 small places (one on each corner) rather than solidly all around the tennon. ***Do not let the tennon bottom out inside the chuck.***
