Tuckessee Woodturners December 1, 2014 Club Meeting

The December club meeting was called to order by President Jon Haigh at 7:00 p.m. on December 1, 2014 at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN.

There were no visitors present.

As members arrived, tickets were handed out to those who brought tools and wood for the wood and tool swap.

President Jon announced there were snacks and soft drinks available to celebrate the holiday meeting.

Treasurer Bruce Hensley, reported that the bank balance is currently \$1,403.46 which includes dues collected and club sales from the November Craft Fair.

President Jon reported things went well at the November Craft Fair.

President Jon was asked what we normally contribute to the FOP in recognition of them allowing us to use the Lodge for our meetings. Last year we donated \$200.00. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to increase the donation to \$300.00 this year.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to donate \$100.00 to the Salvation Army.

Jim Mason suggested the club consider finding a cause we can support on a regular basis to benefit the community and gain publicity. Members will consider possible projects.

A suggestion was made by Charlie Putnam to use some of the club finances to give a club member free tuition for the Nashville Symposium to be held in January. A drawing will be held at the January club meeting with those members who have paid their 2015 club dues eligible to win. There will be an opportunity to pay dues at the meeting before the drawing is held.

President Jon asked if club members were interested in participating in the Irish Festival in Erin this March. There was no interest in participating if we are placed in the same location we had last year. In prior years, we had a better location but were moved last year. Following discussion a motion was made, seconded, and passed authorizing President Jon to sign up if the organizers will give us a better location this year that has a source of electric power.

Jesse Fostser advised he would be getting some wood from a mill his son has purchased Cedar from in the past. His son uses the Cedar to build boxes. Jesse reports he will be able to get:

2" Spalted Maple 8" - 10" wide for \$`1.50/ft.

2" Cherry 6" – 8" wide for \$2.00/ft. Walnut 6" – 8" wide for \$2.50/ft.

Let Jesse know if you want him to order any of this wood for you.
