## Wood Handbook

While reading an article on the internet entitled “A Photographic Guide to Selecting Lumber”, I discovered a link to a book that some of you might be interested in. The book is available from the United States Department of Agriculture and is titled “Wood Handbook, Wood as an Engineering Material”. It can be downloaded in pdf format without charge. The book, over 500 pages in length, contains a wealth of information on wood, wood types, how to use wood in construction, plus lots more. Much of it is technical information while there is also a lot of

## Minutes Tuckesse Woodturners January 4, 2016 Club Meeting

The January club meeting was called to order by President Jon Haigh at 7:00 pm on January 4, 2016 at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN.

Ron Clever and Tim Powers were introduced as visitors. Tim paid his 2016 dues and joined on the spot.

The next turn-in is scheduled for Saturday January 23, 2016.

President Jon has no new information on the Arts Council display scheduled for March.

The next craft show is scheduled for the 1<sup>st</sup> weekend of May in Cadiz Ky. If you are interested in participating, let President Jon know.

Jon Holloway asked if anyone has experienced trouble with their grinder as a result of using the large CBN wheel. Jon has experienced problems but no one else indicated problems.

Bob Forsythe gave an update on Clarence Duzan who has been in the hospital. Bob visited him last week and Clarence might have come home over the weekend. Clarence had his cell phone with him and would appreciate calls.

Steve Sabinash asked members to please fill out the survey he passed out seeking information on what demonstrations club members would like to see at our club meetings. Steve says the next meeting will have 3 or so demonstration stations set up so members can move from one to the other as desired.

Jim Mason reported he is trying to update the email list he uses to distribute the newsletter. He asked members to look at the list of invalid addresses to

provide updates. Jim also announced he would be taking member photos during the demonstration. These will be used to create a photo directory.

Mike Canfield announced he has a face mask and Wolverine sharpening system for sale.

Each meeting, members bring in projects they have been working on and show them during “Show & Tell”. Items displayed this month included:  
Max Harris - Three six sided boxes. One made of Ash, one of Spalted Maple, and one made of Cherry.

Jim Mason - What he called “A Wide Mouth Bass Vase” made of Cherry from the wood pile. A second vase from the same wood. An 18” plain thin platter.

Mike Canfield - Several bowls. Custom Cole Jaws.

Mike Patrick - Acorn Boxes with secret top.

John Riggins - Square Ambrosia Maple bowl.

The program was presented by Mike Canfield. First, he demonstrated how to make the “Grinch” he brought earlier to Show & Tell. The form was inspired by a 150 watt light bulb. Carl Jacobson has a similar project available for view on You Tube. Mike traced the outline for the face onto the wood from a picture using carbon paper. Mike used an air brush and compressor he purchased from Harbor Freight. He uses Acrylic paint thinned to almost water consistency. The colors used were: Lemon Lime, Christmas Green, Red, and White. He started by spraying the Lemon Lime followed by the Christmas Green with the lathe turning. Mike chose not to spray the Red and White on the hat using a brush instead. He said you could use markers for this if you like. He finished the project with Clear Coat.

Next Mike showed us how he makes wooden Christmas lights. This is a good project to improve skills using the skew chisel. He starts with length of 1” dowel. The total bulb length is about 2”. The base is about 3/8” – 1/2” in length and similar in diameter. Mike used a parting tool to cut the base. He sands to the final shape going up to 220 grit sand paper. He uses a small point tool to cut threads in the base. Mike says you can paint with the bulb either on the lathe or off. It is also possible

to use markers for painting. Finish off with Clear Coat. String the bulbs on white cord and add a cheap electrical plug to complete the illusion.

Charlie Putnam will be unable to attend the TAW Symposium in January so a drawing was held for the registration being given away by the club. Our newest member, Tim Powers was the winner.
