Fight the February Funk with Texturing Techniques!

The February meeting will focus on Texturing techniques that can add interest and pizzazz to your finished product. It's cold out and that is a good thing when we are all looking for another reason to spend more time in the workshop!

Texturing can be achieved with a variety of tools that vary from tools made from items found in everybody's shop to specialty tools that can be purchased. There are numerous videos on YouTube that show how to make tools and/or how to use

everyday objects for texturing. And, of course, you can spend as much money as your conscience will let you on tools made specifically for texturing. Texturing can be a great way to make a bowl or platter look fancy and it individualizes each piece with a wide range of patterns. The type of wood used, harder or softer wood, and the kind of grain it has, tighter or looser grain, will impact the way it interacts with the texturing tool.

Show & Tell:

Each meeting, members bring in projects they have been working on and show them. Items shared this month included:

Bryce Ellison	Black Walnut Bowl. Turned using a Bowl Gouge and Scraper. Finished with Tung Oil.
Steve Sabinash	Spalted Elm Box with threaded lid. Stabilized with Cactus Juice.
Jim Mason	Quarter Sawn Sycamore Platter. Finished with Wipe-On-Poly lightly rubbed with Steel Wool between coats.
James Lavery	Shared a book he has found useful as a beginning turner. "Wood Turning – A Foundation Course" by Keith Rowley.

Old Business:

The Gander Memorial Project was a success. Bowls and Pens made from wood harvested from the old memorial site were given to family members of those lost in the Gander crash. The new memorial will feature new trees with more space to adequately grow.

President Steve reminded members of the TAW Symposium to be held this month in Franklin TN. Steve has attended for many years and those who have also attended agree it is an excellent event.

Program:

Blue Bastin presented the first part of our program on Turning Safety. She shared some suggestions she had gathered from various sources which included:

- No loose clothes when turning.
- No Jewelry when turning.
- No loose Hair when turning.
- Wear a dust mask when sanding.
- Wear ear protection.
- Wear eye protection a full face mask or goggles at a minimum.
- Don't go off and leave equipment running.
- Have your tool rest close to the wood being turned.
- Check that the wood does not hit the tool rest before turning the lathe on.
- Clear your mind and only think about what you are doing.
- Gloves. Individual preference. Some use them, some don't. If used a bright color might be good.
- Sharp tools are safer to use than dull tools.

President Steve presented the second part of the program talking about sharpening tools. Steve handed out templates showing how he sets up his grinder to sharpen. Steve says to pick out one grind style and stay with it until you decide it is not working for you then try another if needed. You are looking for a consistent grind every time you sharpen your tools.

Thank you Blue and Steve for sharing useful information with us to start the new year off right!
