**FROM THE SOUTH:** Take N.  $2^{nd}$  Street north onto Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd), Turn Right on Market St, Turn Right on Chapel St, Turn Left on North Ford St. About  $\frac{1}{2}$  mi. rd turns hard right, continue about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)

**FROM THE NORTH**: From Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd) turn left on Chapel St <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mi. turn left on North Ford St. About <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> mi. rd turns hard right, continue about <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)
