Max persevered and we learned a lot. Probably the best lesson was that there is a steep learning curve to use a coring tool and it takes lots of practice!

New Element Discovered

A fire at Los Alamos has had one significant consequence. A secret scientific document was discovered in a bunker whose security systems were mostly destroyed by the fire. This document was leaked to the public last weekend.

Actually it reveals nothing that we didn't already suspect. But it does show that besides arsenic, lead, mercury, radon, strontium and plutonium, one more extremely deadly and pervasive element is known to exist.
