# **Tuckessee Woodturners March 6, 2017 Club Meeting Minutes**

The March Tuckessee Woodturners Club Meeting was called to order by President Steve Sabinash at 7:00 pm on Monday March 6<sup>th</sup> at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN.

There were no visitors at the meeting.

The next Turn-In will be held on March 25<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am until noon at the FOP Lodge on Ford Street in Clarksville. Instructors will be present to help both new and experienced turners turn better. There is no cost. If no one shows by 9:30 am, the instructors will leave for the day.

The March week night turning meeting will be on March 21st from 6:30 pm until 8:30 pm.

President Steve announced that the AAW insurance premium for the club is due by March 15, 2017. Bruce Hensley has been out of town for several weeks so Bob Forsythe has not been able to get the signature authority for the club bank account changed to him.

Charles Wall gave President Steve \$80.00 in cash for club dues payments he has received. President Steve will "loan" the club \$15.00 and pay the \$95.00 insurance premium. When Secretary Bob gets the bank account straightened out, President Steve will be repaid for the "loan".

Jon Holloway asked if anyone knew where we could get some replacement asphalt floor tiles to match those used at the FOP lodge? Moving our large lathe has damaged a couple of the floor tiles and Jon would like to replace them. A couple of suggestions were made and Jon said he would follow up. If he can locate suitable replacements, he will replace the damaged ones.

Jim Mason questioned why the club charges 5% commission on individual items sold at events where the club pays the booth fee. Following discussion, it was clarified that this will only be charged on items sold at the Clarksville Market Place this summer and is administered on the honor system. President Steve said we will give this a try for the summer and decide whether to continue the practice in the fall.

President Steve described a proposal to develop a mentorship program where more advanced members would work with new turners. It was decided that there should be more discussion. In the meantime, Bob Forsythe said he would be glad to help anyone at his shop. If you want help, just contact Bob.

Charles Wall passed out copies of the 2017 picture directory to club members. The club owes Jim Mason \$53.00 to cover the printing costs for the directory. Bob Forsythe said he would see that Jim is paid as soon as possible.

Mike Canfield reminded the club members that Steve Sabinash would be the presenter at the March Tennessee Association of Woodturners meeting to be held Tuesday night March 7, 2017 in Nashville.

The program was presented by Eddie Davidson on Chainsaw Use. Eddies shared several tips including;

- 1. grease the tip of your bar regularly.
- 2. If your saw is turning to one side, file the teeth on the side opposite the way it is turning.
- 3. Use a File Card to clean your file. File Cards are getting hard to find.
- 4. Use non-ethanol gasoline. If not available, put an additive in the gasoline.
- 5. Clean the groove on the bar and rotate the bar regularly.
