The weather has been very moderate for summer in the Mid-South area. I found myself working some of the wood surrounding my shop down to blanks. I have been using Anchor Seal on the blanks to allow them to air dry slowly. I have had a lot of success doing this. It allows me to store the blanks for turning when the temperature is more comfortable in my shop.

The summer time usually is very good time to get wood, but the temperatures make it less pleasant. Another problem with harvesting wood in the summer is insect infestation (post hole beetles, grubs, ants, and many more). I have tried some different insecticides and have found one that has been very effective (Permetherin). It's available at most Farm Supply stores in concentrated form. Thanks to Ed Gill for this tip.

The July 2017 Tuckessee Woodturners Club Meeting was called to order by President Steve Sabinash at 7:00 pm on Monday July 10th at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN.

New member Ben Ferguson was introduced. Roger Andajor, Roger Andojar Jr., Taylor Stanley, Hoye Filbeck, and Diane Filbeck were introduced as guest and prospective members.

President Steve talked about the Blackberry Festival to be held the weekend following this meeting. There is an opportunity to demonstrate and sell crafts. None of the members present expressed interest in participating.

Treasurer Bob Forsythe reported the club bank balance is currently \$1,167.88.

Vice President Eddie Davidson reported from the Tennessee Association of Woodturning, TAW, meeting that registration for their January 2018 symposium will be limited due to Fire Marshall limitations on the number of people who can be safely accommodated in the demonstration rooms. Jim stressed safety as part of his demo as he does every time he demos. Things he stressed this demo were to always wear a face shield when turning and to be sure you turn a flat edge when making a surface to attach your chuck.

Jim's interest in turning Tops was piqued by the AAW Woodturning Fundamentals volume titled "Turners are Tops!". If you are a member of AAW, you can access this document along with many others at the AAW website.

Jim adds color to his Tops with red and blue markers.

Jim issued a challenge to the club members to make Tops and donate them to the club at the August meeting. He will provide a \$25.00 cash prize for a drawing to be held at that meeting. Jim Mason found an article instructions on line on a MOMEMADE CA GLUE ACCELERATOR.

Make a version of cyanoacrylate (CA) glue accelerator at home. Just mix 1/2 teaspoon of baking soda into 1/4 cup of purified water. Brush it onto the "dry" half of the joint. The soda will neutralize the acid in CA glue, which is there to slow the curing time. At this ratio, your homemade accelerator will still give you several seconds of open time to align the parts. But if ou want an immediate cure, increase the soda to 1 teaspoon instead. After trying this on many sample joints made of poplar, the author of this article, Paul Guncheon, Wahiawa, Hawai, noticed no loss of bond strength plus it's odor-free and doesn't stain the wood.
