The May 2018 Tuckessee Woodturners Club Meeting was called to order by President Steve Sabinash at 7:00 pm on Monday May 7<sup>th</sup> at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN. Bill Gunnett was a visitor at the May meeting. Bill is a member of the Wiregrass Woodturners in Dothan Alabama and is visiting here on business. Tom Pressler's wife, Margie, was also a visitor. A report was given on the Vintage Fair held last month. There were five turners in attendance. There was lots of interest at our booth but not a lot of purchases. The club took in approximately \$30.00 from sales.

President Steve reminded us of the Downtown Farmers Market in Clarksville which begins this month. We are signed up for schedule B which includes the following dates:

President Steve announced there will be a Craftsman Fair on May 26<sup>th</sup> at Old Glory Distillery. The club will not have a booth there but if any members are interested in attending on their own, please see Steve for details.

Treasurer Bob Forsythe reported the club bank balance is \$1,094.26 after paying for the Downtown Farmers Market Booth.

John Duzan reminded us that the Dickson club is planning a youth wood turning event in conjunction with the YMCA July  $12^{th} - 14^{th}$ . The club is looking for turning instructors and general help. If you are interested in helping, see John.

John Duzan also reported that he had been by Eddie Davidson's home in the past few days and saw Eddie out planting Potatoes. Eddie is still active and fighting. A card was circulated for members to sign which will be sent to Eddie.

Each meeting, members bring in projects they have been working on and show them during "Show & Tell". Items displayed this month included:

Jim Mason - A Maple Bowl decorated using Pyrography (wood burning).

A large, 19", Cherry Bowl.

Bryce Ellison - Two Glasses.

"Orange" Bowl.

John Duzan - Display of Ink Pens made by his father, Clarence Duzan.

Max Harris - New Improved Flask.

Cherry Bowl Decorated with Worm Holes.

The program was presented by our own Steve Sabinash who gave us tips on how to make our own tools and how to sharpen them.

Steve says he uses pre-hardened drill bit stock to make tools. Two sources of High Speed Steel are Global and McMaster-Carr.

Steve showed us how he uses Dewaxed Shellac Flakes mixed with Denatured Alcohol as a sealer. This is particularly useful on Pine and Cedar as it seals against the resins coming out. Steve says you can use any finish over the shellac.

Steve showed us a group of sharpening templates he made using patterns put online by Carl Ford. These patterns can be found at Carl's web site, <a href="https://www.carlford.us">www.carlford.us</a>.

Steve tells us one of the best investment for sharpening tools is a CBN wheel. According to Steve each time a tool is sharpened with a conventional wheel, about \$0.40 of steel is removed. When a CBN wheel is used only about \$0.10 of steel is removed. This greatly increases the life of your tools.

Steve showed us how to sharpen drill bits on a CBN wheel using a protractor.

Steve prefers to use removable handles for his tools. He secures the tool in the handle with 5/16" set screws.

FROM THE SOUTH:: Take N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street north onto Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd), Turn Right on Market St, Turn Right on Chapel St, Turn Left on North Ford St. About ½ mi. rd turns hard right, continue about ½ mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)

FROM THE NORTH: From Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd) turn left on Chapel St About ¼ mi. turn left on North Ford St. About ½ mi. rd turns hard right, continue about ½ mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)
