Meeting Minutes

June 3, 2019 Club Meeting Minutes

The June 2019 Tuckessee Woodturners Club Meeting was called to order by President Steve Sabinash at 7:00 pm on Monday June 3rd, 2019 at the FOP Lodge 2576 North Ford Street in Clarksville TN.

Guests at the meeting were Roy and Shelley Mack along with Anthony Evans.

President Steve reported on the activity at the Farmer's Market held on June 1st. There was lots of traffic but not much interest in the turning demonstrations. We are scheduled to participate on:

June 15, 29 July 13, 27 August 10, 24 September 14, 28 October 12

President Steve had a discussion with the leadership of the FOP Lodge where we hold our meetings, our turn-ins, and store our lathes. We have been donating \$300.00 per year to them for our use of the building. Their normal facility usage charge is \$25.00 per event. They are asking us to increase our payment to their standard amount. Charles Wall made a motion to increase our yearly donation to \$600.00 per year to be paid on a schedule of their preference. The motion was seconded by Jon Haigh and passed.

There was discussion regarding our plan to participate in the Gander Memorial Garden upgrade at Fort Campbell. Our club is planning to make memorial remembrances for each of the families using the wood from the trees being removed. We would like to have the items completed by December 12, 2019 for distribution at the garden unveiling.

John Duzan reminded us that the Dickson Woodturning Club will again be hosting their Junior Woodturning Event this summer. The dates are July 11 – 13, 2019 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm at the Dickson YMCA. Jon Haigh volunteered to help with the event. Others who are willing to help should let John Duzan know. Bob Forsythe made a motion authorizing the Dickson Club to use our equipment (Lathes, etc.) at no cost for the event. The motion was seconded by Mike Canfield and passed.

Treasurer, Bob Forsythe, reported we have \$1,371.26 in the bank. This does not include income from the sales at the June 1 Farmer's Market.

Harold Parkinson - Bowl finished with Johnson Paste Wax.

John Duzan introduced Jim Mason, from our club, who will give a program on Pyrography, the art of decorating wood with burn marks. This is the kickoff presentation for our program series on Embellishment.

Jim became interested in Pyrography after seeing Cynthia Gibson's presentation at the 29th TAW Symposium in Nashville. He purchased the tools she recommended in her presentation. Foremost on the list of tools is an electric fan. A tip - don't blow the fan on the piece you are working on. It cools the work and makes the process more difficult. Another tip from Jim, when carbon builds up on the burning tip, stick the tip into a block of Paraffin. Jim also uses a 600 grit Diamond Pad to clean and sharpen his burning tools. Jim is "Old School" and uses carbon paper to transfer the image he is going to burn to the wood. (Young guys may not know about carbon paper!)

Thanks Jim, for an entertaining and informative presentation.

Take N. 2nd Street north onto Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd), turn right on Market St, turn right on Chapel St, turn left on North Ford St. About one-half mile road turns hard right. Continue about one-half mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)

FROM THE NORTH

From Hwy 41A (Providence Blvd) turn left on Chapel St About ¼ mi. turn left on North Ford St. About ½ mi. rd turns hard right, continue about ½ mile to the last building on the Left. (F.O.P. Lodge)
